

Validate & Verify – Do you have access to Manual hCG Entry?

Per [testing policy](#), point-of-care Alere Urine hCG test results must be entered into the Glucose or Creatinine meters to ensure the results are transmitted to IHIS as a lab test.

WHY?

- Use the **Manual Entry** function on the Glucose/Creatinine meter to record patient pregnancy results; this automatically uploads the result to the patient's chart as a lab test.
- This process ensures tracking of hCG testing documented as a lab test and test cassette lot validation.

WHAT TO LOOK FOR?

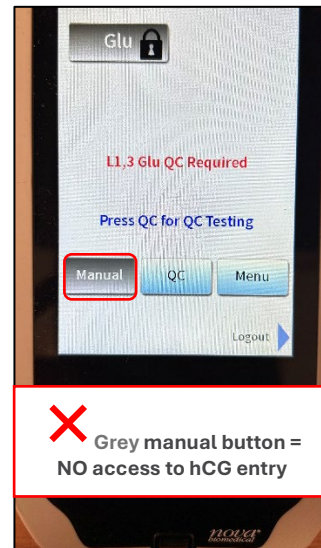
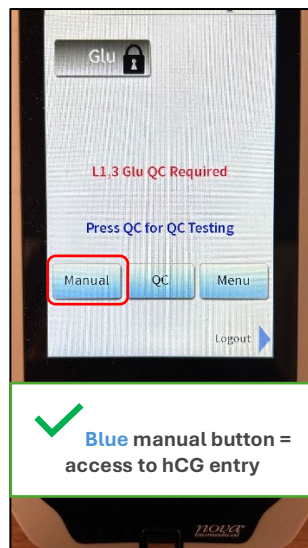
- **Validate & verify** – do you have manual entry access on your Glucose/Creatinine meter? See image below.

WHEN DO I NEED ACCESS?

- After processing and interpreting a pregnancy test, then enter the result in the glucose meter under **Manual Entry**.

HOW DO I GET ACCESS?

- To obtain access, complete both:
 - 1) take the POC Alere Urine hCG CBL on Buckeye Learn, and
 - 2) in-person training from POC or your department SuperuserAfter completing initial training, reach out to POC to update your hCG manual test entry access.
- **Initial training is one-time only**. If you have previously completed initial training and took the annual CBL but lost access to manual test entry function, contact POC.
